# Interfraternity Council Scholarships

## Who:

The Interfraternity Council (IFC) is a collective body of governance and representation for 22 member fraternities on the University of Minnesota campus. One of the purposes of this council, as stated in its bylaws and constitution, is, “to perpetuate the fraternal ideal and respect for the principles on which it was founded.” Fraternity foundations are rooted in service, community involvement, leadership, character, morality, and scholastic achievement.

All male students entering the University of Minnesota for the first time for the Fall Semester are eligible to apply.

## What:

To further fraternity ideals, the Interfraternity Council has decided to offer \$5000 in scholarships to incoming students. The scholarships will be distributed through one \$1000 scholarship, four \$500 scholarships, and eight \$250 scholarships. The scholarships will be awarded based on merit. The IFC is seeking applicants who personify fraternity values of service, leadership, academic achievement, and community involvement.

## How/When/Where:

Applicants will submit the following form by August 15 along with their essay responses and any other additional information. The applications will be reviewed and finalists may be called for interviews. The scholarship recipients will be notified and the scholarships will then be awarded in September at a legislative meeting of the Interfraternity Council.

## Why:

Fraternal organizations were founded on principles, beliefs, and values that dictated high standards for living. Some of the most common themes found within all fraternities are the concepts of community, service, leadership, brotherhood, and scholarly achievement. To communicate and fully exemplify these ideals, our fraternity community believes in giving back to those who live with the same standard. Awarding scholarships communicates our commitment to successful students, community leaders, and men of character, and assists young men with their transition to the collegiate environment.
